Better Together #2:

Commissioned to Reach out Together

Reach out and welcome one another for the glory of God. Jesus did it, now you do it! (Romans 15.7). Let us stop just saying we love people; let us really love them, and show it by our actions (1 John 3.18). Let us work together, struggling side by side to get others to believe the Good News (Philippians 1.27b)

In week one of Better Together, we heard the compelling call to love one another within the church. In week two we heard of our commissioning to reach those outside the

Everything begins in the church with how we understand our mission. Our Mission Statement on the front page of our bulletin each week says that: First Baptist Church is a loving and caring Christian community seeking to extend the open hand of God's grace to meet physical and spiritual needs through worship, education, ministry, fellowship, and spiritual nurturing. When we "extend the open hand of God's grace" we are Reaching Out.

We have to be intentional about reaching out, inviting people to church, showing acceptance, building friendships with those who do not know Christ, offering hospitality and welcome through small groups of people like Sunday School classes, and seeking to address the real needs of our community through meaningful acts of service.

We need to value impact and influence in the community more than church attendance. The effectiveness of our worship and Bible Study and fellowship is measured not by attendance but by the impact the people of our church have on our community. Internally focused churches concentrate on getting people into the church and generating activity inside the church. Externally focused churches concentrate on getting members out into the community and engaging in service outside the church. Church "success" depends on getting involved in the community, creating authentic relationships, and being truly helpful. We need to be the kind of place that would be greatly missed if we were not here.

An externally focused church moves toward those on the margins. God has a special place in his heart for those on the margins of society. In scripture we are commissioned to minister to broken people. There are nearly 400 biblical passages demonstrating God's concern for orphans, prisoners, and immigrants, the homeless, the poor, and the hungry, the sick, and the disabled. An externally focused church seeks the well-being of their cities, blessing their cities by offering classes to the community at banks and hospitals and libraries, teaching job skills and life skills, helping others to thrive.

A critical question every church must ask themselves is this: Do we want to *impress* others or influence others?

One pastor says, "Most churches are about 'Serve us!' rather than 'service." The first perspective reflects an internal focus: "Meet my needs and make me happy." The second perspective is directed outwardly: "Help me make this world a better place." There are many Christians who need to change the question from "What can the church do for me?" to "What can we as the church do for the community?" The church must always ask ourselves: "Are we enhancing our community?" Most of the time when people ask each other about their church they want to know about its size and worship attendance. Maybe the conversation needs to change to: "Tell me about the difference your church is making in your community."

So think about it: What is happening in our community because of our church? What do we want to happen in our community because of our church?


